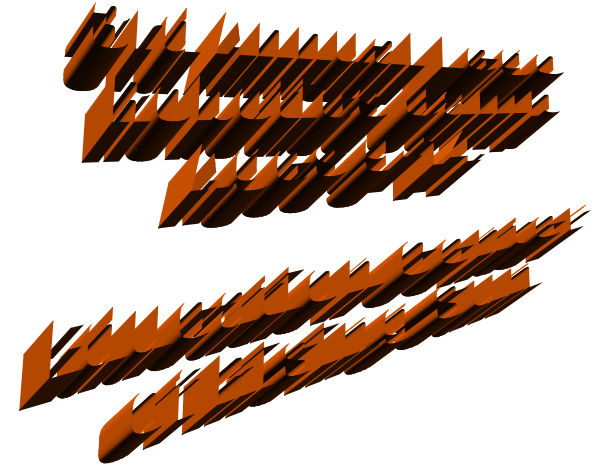

This camp is designed for Beginners. The camp will introduce students to the Lego Mindstorm NXT. The camp will last for two full days and one half day. Lunch will be provided on the two full-day camp sessions.

This camp is designed for those who have had experience with the Lego Mindstorm NXT.

Students will participate in pairs to build various projects with the Lego Mindstorm. Students will all be building but not necessarily the same type of robot.

Lego Robotics Camp

Campers will be using the LEGO NXT Robotics system to design, build and program their robot from scratch. While building robots during the summer camp, campers not only accumulate skills in engineering, computer science, and physics, they also learn valuable leadership and project management skills that will help them throughout their life.

Participants will begin by following instructions to build a robot using LEGO™ bricks. Included in the building materials is a programmable logic controller. PLCs are found in many ordinary applications like garage door openers and stop lights. However, PLCs are also used extensively in manufacturing plants to control materials and processes. Sensors provide input information to the PLCs which then execute a specific program based on the input. The LEGO™ robots built by the participants behave exactly the same way. Participants are presented with several challenges that require the use of touch, light, rotation, and ultrasonic sensors to solve. Concepts of science, technology, engineering and mathematics are presented in a fun, hands-on, minds-on way to engage campers.

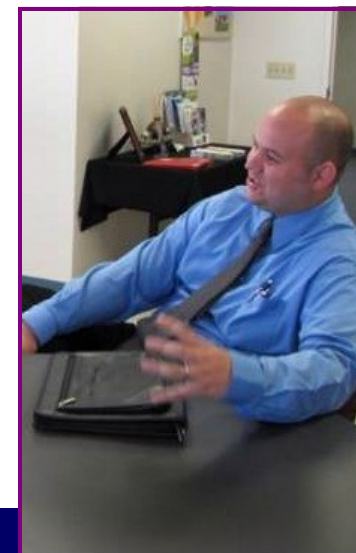

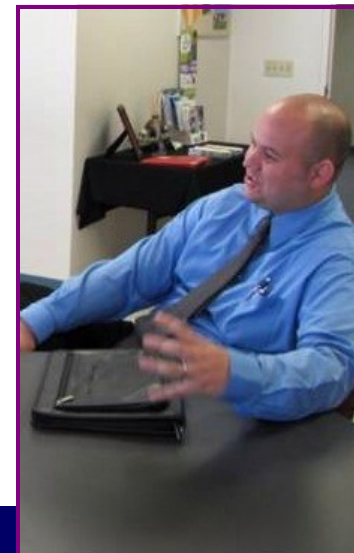
