Austin, Indiana has been selected as a Good Works City by the Indiana Office of Faith Based and Community Initiatives. Mayor Campbell and the Austin City Council announce the award of a \$50,000 grant that will assist in a collaborative initiative between the City, faith-based organizations and not-for profits to assist families living below 200 per cent of poverty to gain educational and work skills.

As a result of these funds, space and furnishings in the Cherry Street Community Center are being enhanced to provide a variety of programs. Currently, Circles out of Poverty and Afternoons Rock is housed there. Adult Education and computer classes will be available starting June 6 through the Scott County Partnership. Other funds are going to help afterschool activities at the Austin Learning Center and Afternoons Rock at Grace Covenant.

An **Austin Summer Adventure Program**, developed through the Austin Youth Committee, will be coordinated through this grant. The purpose is to help the community to provide positive educational and enrichment activities for Austin families and children during the summer months.

Community churches and organizations are encouraged to coordinate family summer activities through Summer Adventure Coordinator, Melissa Lytle. An informational meeting is scheduled May 26 at 6:30 PM at Austin City Hall on how to access some mini-grant to fund summer events. Representatives from Austin Churches and organizations are invited to attend. A **Austin Summer Adventure** kick-off event is scheduled for Saturday June 4 at the parking lot between City Hall and the Fire Department in Austin. All families and children are invited.

Mayor Campbell stated: "This is a wonderful opportunity for Austin to assist families and youth in their personal employment and educational goals by bringing services to Austin through this grant."
