2 BENEFITS OF BEING A HOST AGENCY

Access Skilled Workers: bring experienced, motivated individuals to your team.

Save on Costs: participants receive a stipend, reducing your hiring expenses.

Boost Your Team: add new perspectives and skills to your organization.



3 REQUIREMENTS TO HOST

501(c)(3) nonprofit or public agency
Provide valuable work experience
Follow federal and state labor laws
Offer supervision and support
Ensure a safe work environment

4 BENEFITS OF BEING A PARTICIPANT

Upgrade your job skills and work experience through “on-the-job” experience, providing community service, and attending training workshops. Earn income during training while getting involved in your community. Unsubsidized employment is a job where you are on the employer’s payroll directly.



5 PARTICIPANT REQUIREMENTS

To qualify, you must be 55 or older, unemployed, and have a family income at or below 125% of the federal poverty level. Priority is given to veterans, individuals 65 and older, those with disabilities, and others facing job market challenges.
